PREFATORY NOTE

Before the inception of the National Health Service the annual Statistical Summaries prepared by the King's Fund provided the recognised means of assessing the work of London voluntary hospitals. These figures can no longer be published for hospitals, but a large number of convalescent homes are still operating independently, and all those on the books of the Fund are required to furnish accounts and statistics on a uniform basis—The Revised Uniform System for Small Hospitals.

The Revised Uniform System provides that accounts and statistics shall be published for the calendar year 1st January—31st December and shall be audited by a Chartered or an Incorporated Accountant. In view of the requirements of the Ministry of Education, however, the Committee have agreed to accept accounts and statistics for the year 1st April—31st March from those Homes receiving grants from the Ministry. The condition regarding the qualification of the auditor has also been temporarily relaxed.

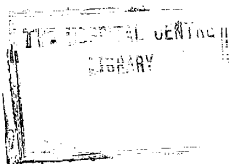
The Convalescent Homes Committee of the Fund have prepared the following Summary primarily for its own information, but it is thought that the Homes concerned in this Summary might find the figures interesting and helpful.

Section I summarises, under their main heads and sub-heads, the various items of Income and Expenditure, as set out on page 2, and Section II, statistics of accommodation and patients and analysis of cost.

The 66 homes included in the Summary have been placed in three roughly comparable groups—Men and Women, Children and Infants, and Special Schools. It should be borne in mind that there are many factors attaching to the running of convalescent homes which may lead to apparently startling differences in costs, etc., as between one home and another, which could only be explained by a more detailed examination of all the circumstances.
