PREFATORY NOTE

Before the inception of the National Health Service the annual Statistical Summaries prepared by the King's Fund provided the recognised means of assessing the work of London voluntary hospitals. These figures can no longer be published for hospitals, but a large number of convalescent homes are still operating independently and all those on the books of the Fund are required to furnish accounts and statistics on a uniform basis—The Revised Uniform System for Small Hospitals.

The Convalescent Homes Committee of the Fund prepared the following Summary primarily for its own information, but requests received from various quarters have led to the decision to make it generally available.

The 64 homes included in the Summary have been placed in four roughly comparable groups—Men and Women, Children, Infants, and Special Schools. Although only one home is at present included under Infants, there will be an increase in future Summaries. It should be borne in mind that there are many factors attaching to the running of convalescent homes which may lead to apparently startling differences in costs as between one home and another which can only be ascertained by a more detailed examination of all the circumstances.

Section I summarises under their main heads and sub-heads the various items of Income and Expenditure, as set out on page 2, and Section II statistics of accommodation and patients and analysis of cost.

The Revised Uniform System provides that accounts and statistics shall be published for the calendar year 1st January—31st March and shall be audited by a Chartered or an Incorporated Accountant. In view of requirements of the Ministry of Education, however, the Committee have agreed to accept accounts and statistics for the year 1st April—31st March from those Homes receiving grants from the Ministry. The condition regarding the qualification of the auditor has also been temporarily relaxed.
